CORE SERVICES



EMERGENCY SHELTER

SafePlace operates Thurston County's only shelter for survivors of domestic violence, providing safety and stability for survivors and their children.

LEGAL ADVOCACY

SafePlace advocates provide support for survivors as they navigate the legal system, assisting with protection orders, court accompaniment, and legal resources.

24/7 HELPLINE

SafePlace advocates provide immediate crisis support and connect clients to resources 24-hours a day.



YOUTH AND PREVENTION SERVICES

SafePlace advocates work with youth in our community, teaching educating them in trauma-informed care, healthy boundaries, consent, and more.

SEXUAL ASSAULT SERVICES

SafePlace advocates provide drop-in services for survivors and provide emergency hospital advocacy which includes accompanying survivors to Sexual Assault Nurse Examinations and interviews with law enforcement.

VIOLENCE AFFECTS US ALL

An average of 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States.

Over 1 in 3 women (35.6%) and 1 in 4 men (28.5%) in the United States have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime.



Children witness violence in nearly 1 in 4 (22%) intimate partner violence cases filed in state courts.

Approximately 1 in 5 women and 1 in 7 men who experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner first experienced some form of partner violence between 11 and 17 years of age.

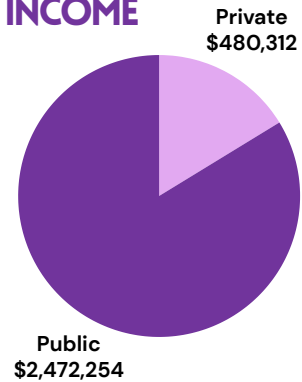

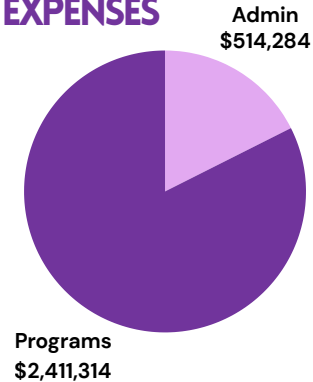
